Letter from our Founder

2024 was a powerful year of growth, connection, and deepened impact for AndThenlWasFree. We are proud to continue providing culturally specific, trauma-informed support to LGBTQ2S+ and Indigenous youth across Ontario.

This year, we raised over \$60,000 through grants, sponsorships, and donations. Of this, 80% went directly into programming that supports our community, with just 20% allocated to administrative and operational costs. We are fully volunteer-run, and every dollar is maximized to create meaningful change.

We engaged 25 dedicated volunteers who helped us extend our reach and deliver highimpact programming throughout the province. AndThenlWasFree proudly participated in and celebrated at Pride events in Toronto, Muskoka, Kawartha Lakes, Belleville, Peterborough, Kingston, and the Two-Spirit Pow Wow, creating safer, more supportive spaces wherever we went.

We led impactful workshops for several organizations including the Rural Institute of Ontario, Rural Change Makers, Native Child, and the City of Toronto, and shared our knowledge and lived experience in ways that center identity, healing, and resilience.

This year also marked the successful launch of our Celebrating & Supporting Two-Spirit Youth initiative - an achievement we are incredibly proud of. We were able to reach more youth than ever before, and the stories, strength, and feedback we've received remind us how necessary and overdue this work truly is. From peer support groups to one-on-one affirming care, from educator support to community presence, our efforts have resonated deeply.

We know this work doesn't happen in isolation. It takes a network of committed individuals, community partners, funders, and grassroots supporters. This year, we were honoured to be a beneficiary of the Pride & Remembrance Foundation Pride Run (priderun.org). As one of the selected beneficiaries, we not only received generous financial support but were also uplifted by an incredibly passionate and engaged community of runners and donors. This partnership amplified our visibility, strengthened our community connections, and directly contributed to our ability to launch and expand Trans and Two-Spirit youth programming.

We are continually inspired by the generosity, advocacy, and encouragement from our community. Each act of support, whether a donation, a shared story, a social media like, or volunteer hour, is what allows us to show up for youth every single day.

We are grateful to everyone who has supported us over the past year, and we look forward to making an even bigger impact this year.

In 2024, AndThenIWasFree raised over \$60,000 through community-driven grants, donations, and sponsorships – a total that included 135 individual donations from generous supporters across Ontario. This critical funding allowed us to support our community through a range of impactful initiatives.

We engaged 25 active volunteers who played a key role in delivering programming and outreach efforts. Our team had a proud presence at seven Pride events across Ontario, including Toronto, Muskoka, Belleville, Kawartha Lakes, Peterborough, Kingston, and the Two-Spirit Pow Wow, creating inclusive and affirming spaces wherever we went.

We hosted 50 peer support groups for LGBTQ2S+ and Indigenous youth, providing vital opportunities for connection and care. Eighteen individuals received personalized support including gender-affirming care (e.g., binders), grocery and food assistance, and essential home items such as beds and kitchenware. Through events, groups, workshops, and direct resource sharing, we reached over 1,750 community members throughout the year.

Project name: Critical Support for Two-Spirit and Trans Youth

AndThenlWasFree's project, Critical Support for Two-Spirit and Trans Youth, will include interactive workshops and support groups for Indigenous Two-Spirit youth that incorporate Indigenous culture and teachings as well as discussions around lateral violence.

Additionally, we will run workshops and support groups to support the unique challenges and shared experiences of Trans and Monbinary youth. We will deliver inclusivity and anti-bullying workshops for middle and high-school students, and conduct Trans and Two-Spirit training and sensitivity workshops for educators. Through our project, we'll foster a community that celebrates diversity, empowers individuals, and amplifies the voices of Trans and Two-Spirit youth.


